Insulator & Firestop Apprentices receive the increase based on their yearly percentage rates.

ASBESTOS WORKERS LOCAL 24 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

We are pleased to announce the fourteenth annual Asbestos Workers Local 24 Memorial Scholarship Fund! This fund is to help offset the cost of college for our members, spouses, and children of active members. We will award the scholarship through a random drawing at our December Union Meeting/Christmas Party. The amount awarded will be based on the number of applications that are received. The amount awarded will be determined based on the number of eligible applicants. To be eligible to apply:

- 1. The member must be active and in good standing with Local 24.
- 2. You or your spouse or child must take a minimum of six credits per semester.
- 3. Complete an application in its entirety and return it to the Union Office by Monday, November 29, 2010. One application per student will be accepted. You may apply even if you've won previously. Call the Union Office for an application.
- 4. Upon winning, provide proof of college enrollment in

an accredited college for the Fall 2010 semester or the Spring 2011 semester. It is not necessary to provide proof of enrollment to apply for this scholarship; however, no funds will be dispersed until such enrollment is verified.

5. In order to be eligible for this drawing, you must have applied for the Koonz, McKenney, Johnson, DePaolis & Lightfoot Scholarship that was available this past spring.
